

Year 9 Food Science - Mrs Nash



We wish both Drew and Finn every success in their academic and professional journeys!



What We Did

“We had gone to Manjedal Activity Centre. The courses that we had participated in included the Rockclimbing Wall and the High Ropes Course. The rock wall was 15 metres tall, and three were able to go at once. I had gone on the furthest one from the entrance of the rock wall; I think it was the hardest one of the three, with several points where I was struggling. The high ropes courses was a tough challenge that consisted of what the instructors call the zombie ladder, rope wall, planks, and balls the other courses had different: smaller planks, a bridge, and a tyre swing. The day consisted of the rock wall and high ropes, both being tough challenges that scared a lot of people, including the rock wall, my favourite of the two.
